Tobacco retail density in British Columbia


In British Columbia, tobacco retailers are required to have a Tobacco Retail Authorization (TRA), which is issued under the authority of the *Tobacco Tax Act* and its regulations. This requirement has been in place since 2007. There is no cost for receiving this authorization, but retailers must meet certain conditions:

- Those who receive authorization must be "actively in the business".
- There must be a separate authorization for each retail outlet.

With these conditions in place, the number of retailers who are authorized to sell tobacco products can be accepted as a reasonable estimate of the number of retailers. A list of the number of retailers authorized to retail tobacco in October 2019 in each B.C. community was obtained from the B.C. Ministry of Finance.

As might be expected, there are significant differences in the density of retail outlets. Expressed in terms of density of retailers per population, there are relatively fewer retailers in the highly populated lower mainland, and relatively more in the more sparsely populated northern regions. Expressed as density per physical area, retailers are far more sparsely located in the north, interior and coastal areas.
